Union County soccer suffered a pair of tough losses to private school power Greater Atlanta Christian on Friday evening in Norcross.

In the opener, the Lady Panthers fell 10-1 with the lone goal coming via Madison Yost off a Braedyn Robbins' assist.

But according to Coach Tim Hunter, the game seemed closer than the final score indicated.

Union County was unable to catch a break, most

In a shocking announcement last week, Union County Head Girls Basketball Coach David Tucker resigned from his position.

Tucker, after winning his 700th career game earlier this season, told the North Georgia News that he had no plans of retiring in the near future and that reaching 800 wins was a real possibility.

More details on Tucker's decision and the search for his replacement will be available in next week's edition of the North Georgia News.

The news broke on Tuesday morning when an Internal Vacancy Notice email was sent to all employees of Union County Schools from UCHS Principal John Hill.

The open position was for basketball coach with an anticipated start date of Apr. 17.

Later in the day, the North Georgia News confirmed that Tucker would not return to the Union County sidelines in 2017-

Tucker has won more than 115 games at Union County with 51 coming as boys coach from 2010-2013

Upon his arrival prior to the 2010-11 season, the boys program was coming off its lowest win total in 15 years

In his first season he won 19 games - including the White County Tip Off Tournament and

He also temporarily ended the boys' struggles with Dawson County when Union defeated the Tigers in Dawsonville for the first time in eight years.

Upon taking over as the coach of the Lady Panthers, he guided Union to five consecutive State Tournaments and two Region Runner-Up finishes.

He was seconds away from claiming the 8-AA title in 2015 until Rabun County pulled a rabbit out of its hat and connected on a long-distance, desperation heave at the buzzer to snatch the region crown from Union.

In 2016, his Lady Panthers ended a seven-year drought when they reached the Sweet 16 for the first time since 2009

This past season, Tucker was forced to rely heavily on freshmen and sophomores and Union was unable to find much consistency and finished 12-14 during its first year of playing in Class AAA.
