Soccer: Lady Panthers record shutouts vs Fannin, Gilmer

Towns County knocks off Union 5-1 behind 2 goals each from Barrett and Neumyer

After recording a key region victory on Monday with a 1-0 shutout of Fannin County to improve to 2-3 in 7-AAA, the Lady Panthers finished off the week by splitting a pair of nonregion contests on the road.

The loss came on Thursday when Union traveled to Hiawassee, looking to reverse its fortunes vs the rival Lady Indians but came up on the wrong end of

The Lady Panthers have lost four straight vs Towns with the last non-loss coming in 2014 in the form of a 2-2 tie.

Union's last win vs the Lady Indians came in February of 2013 but since that 2-1 victory, they have gone 0-6-1 vs TCHS.

When the two rivals met earlier this season it appeared to be an evenly matched battle for most of the contest until a late goal allowed Towns to escape with a 1-0 victory.

This time around, the Lady Indians jumped out to a 2-0 advantage and were never threatened after halftime.

With 26:59 remaining, Towns stretched its lead to 3-0 before a Brooke Barrett penalty kick at the 15:38 mark made it a 4-0 game. Their fifth and final goal came with 7:19 to play.
