Track: Underwood approaching 46-year old school record in 3200M

Freshman Zoe Sanchez eyes Emma Garrison's school record time

Hayesville, NC - Union County junior Lance Underwood and freshman Zoe Sanchez are both nearing history in the 3200-meter event.

Last week at Hayesville, NC, Underwood finished first in the 3200M with a personal record (PR) time of 10 minutes and 44 seconds.

He is currently eight seconds (one second per lap) away from David Bryant's school record time of 10:36.7 set in 1971.

Sanchez also took home first in the girls' 3200M race coming within one second of Garrison's record time.

According to Union County Track and Field Head Coach Shawnetta Reece, some others are also on the verge of setting school records.

"Adrian Shaw in the 400m and Dylan Dockery in the 300 hurdles are knocking closely on the door of a new school record," Reece said. "We are currently awaiting official times for a few events from Hayesville that could determine other records being broken."

Union County fell to 5-10 on the year and 1-8 in region play after three one-sided losses to third ranked North Hall last week, and have now dropped nine of its last 10 games after opening the season 4-0.


