## World Champion DT Express softball still riding high at 65+

Sitting in his Davenport Transportation office just outside Blairsville, former Union County Board of Education Chair Gary Davenport is surrounded by plaques, trophies, rings and numerous awards as he fondly recalled how his senior slow-pitch softball team accomplished the feat of becoming world champions in just 10 years.

The journey began in the 50+ age bracket in 2009, and a 2011 SBA National Championship soon followed in 2011. Over the next decade, the DT Express team climbed through the ranks, winning over 40 tournaments, highlighted by a trip to Las Vegas, Nevada in 2019 to claim the 60+ world championship.

"We went out to Vegas (in 2019), played terribly, and lost the first game of pool play," Davenport said. "I thought, 'Boy, we wasted our money.' But we came back and started hitting the ball. And every year but one that we've gone out there, we've finished in the top five."

Having progressed from AAA, Major and even Major Plus / Gold classifications, DT Express has secured nine first-place trophies since 2023 in the 65+ division.

"We started out playing AAA, then when we won in '19 they moved us to Major and we've been Major or Major Plus ever since," Davenport said. "And once you move up, it's hard to go back down a division. It usually takes at least two years before they let you move back down.'

It all culminated 15 years ago when a friend from



Davenport had taken over the program and become its primary sponsor, marking the birth of "DT Express."

So far in 2024, DT Express has taken first place in seven out of its 10 tournaments. Notable wins include the ISSA Senior Softball Rocket City Spring National in Huntsville, Alabama; the ISSA First Coast USA Championship in Jacksonville, Florida; the ISSA Great Smoky Mountain Senior Classic in Knoxville, Tennessee; and the ISSA/ WBSC World Tournament of has transitioned to the middle-Champions in Tampa, Florida.

"We're going to stick with it [the team] as long as we can," Davenport said. "The thing is, when you move up into a new age division, you're really strong for the first two years, but then you start to drop off the older you get. You also start seeing less teams as you get into the older divisions."

The DT Express roster features players from four states. Members hailing from north Georgia include Ralph Davenport, Marty Dockins, Mike Gordon, Curt Maurer, Steve Palacios, Scotty Welch and Gary Davenport.

Eight team members call Tennessee home: Bobby Adams, Richard Bozarth, Tim Dancer, Weldon Hughes, Thomas Moore, Timothy Moore, Art Pendergrass and Ronnie Rogers.

The roster features four Floridians: Jeff Cherry, Rusty Hoard, Kevin Hogan and Robert Maguire. Last but not least, Ronnie Joslin resides in Mississippi.

"Most of these guys I've been playing with for at least 10 years," Gary Davenport said. "We still have seven from our world championship in 2019. This team I'm with now, it's the best team I've ever played with. We got a bunch of good guys."

With a multi-state roster, practices are few and far between. As a result, the players participate in local leagues to stay in shape.

"I play doubleheaders on Wednesdays in Clayton just to keep my timing down, but through November.
