Union thumps Jackets 60-7; improve to 2-0 for fourth straight year

Panthers to host Andrews, NC on Friday in 2017 home opener

Hayesville, NC - The Panthers showed no mercy on Friday night in Hayesville, ŃC.

On the heels of a 56-14 victory, it would be difficult to top the 42-point beatdown they laid on Gilmer County, but they did.

Just as they did in Ellijay one week prior, Union County jumped out to a 28-0 lead after a quarter. Unlike the Gilmer game, they were able to put the game out of reach during the second, allowing the starters to rest for

Senior quarterback Cole Wright finished with a career low in passing yards due to getting half the night off and the defense constantly setting him up with a short field. Wright connected on 7-of-15 pass attempts for 72 yards and two scores. On the ground he only carried six times for 97 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

"I thought (Wright) played pretty well and his composure was better," Coach Allison said. "It was just a situation where we didn't need to throw the ball a

On the game's opening drive, the Panthers went 66 yards in less than two minutes – the second longest scoring drive of the night for the first team offense. Wright found Kyle Morlock for 10 yards and Chad Buzzard carried for nine more to move Union across the midfield in two plays.

A first down scramble by Wright was followed by runs of five and 20 yards from Buzzard. With a first down at the 18, Kanon Hemphill took advantage of single coverage and raced down the sideline, directly under a perfectly-placed ball from Wright in the end zone.

Facing a 3rd-and-23, Hayesville put the ball on the turf and the Panthers took over at the 10-yard line. A first down incompletion then an 8-yard carry by Buzzard brought up a 3rd-and-goal at the two. Six-feet from pay-dirt, Union kept it simple and handed to Buzzard, who bulldozed his way across the goal line for a 14-0 lead, less than

Buzzard racked up 76 yards and a score on 11 carries before calling it a night at


On the ensuing Jackets' drive, senior lineman Matthew Beise and junior linebacker Jackson Colwell blew up an inside handoff on 3rd-and-2 to force a punt. The Panthers would take over at their own 44 as the rain showers began to intensify.

"The defensive line played much better I thought," Coach Allison said. "We're still a little too high (out of their stance) but we're getting much better and we're moving much better." A second down screen to


Sawyer Drake picked up nine then a 21-yard keeper by Wright had Union in business. Another scamper from Wright set up 1stand-goal at the five but a Buzzard no-gain and an incompletion brought up third down. This time, Wright kept it himself and outran the Hayesville defense around the left edge for six.

Brian Smith's third extra point made it 21-0 at the 5:07 mark of the opening quarter.

Hayesville found a little bit of success with the quarterback scramble and put themselves in scoring position during the early stages of the second quarter. With a 4th-and-2 at the 22, the Panthers defense tightened up and dropped the Jackets for a loss.

"We had some assignment issues on defense with the quarterback scrambling around because we were out of position," Coach Allison said. "Twice we were in the wrong gap and it opened up a running lane for the quarterback. But other than the scrambles, I don't think they had a whole lot of yards.'

The Jackets used a 7-yard completion and an 18-yard run to advance the ball near midfield with less than a minute left. With enough time for Hayesville to get on the board, Union junior safety Chayton Schafer picked up another Jackets fumble and took it the other way for 48 yards. With 41 seconds left, Schafer's scoop-and-score opened up a 46-0 lead after holder Pierson Allison hit Pattee in the endzone for a 2-point conversion on a fake

"If nobody is over the top of me then we automatically run that play," Pattee said. "That's a play that's always there and if nobody is covering me when we

That's something we work on every week in practice," Coach Allison added. "At that point, with the score what it was, we probably should have told them not to do it, but it wasn't their fault. They were just doing what they've been coached to do.

With a 46-0 advantage ville offense converted its first at the break, the third quarter opened with a running clock and the Panthers didn't take possession until the 3:20 mark of the period when the Jackets turned it over on downs at the 29-yard Pierson Allison took over

scoring drive in seven plays. Dockrey carried twice for seven yards, Cayden Rich hauled in two passes for 35 yards and Pierson Allison rushed once for

Morlock had two nine yard grabs on the drive with the second resulting in a score on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Trailing 53-0 Hayesville answered with a 10-play, 65-yard scoring drive to get on the board with 5:07 remaining.

A 30-yard kick return by Zion Ross moved the ball out to the 35 where freshman Kaston Hemphill took over at quarterback. Two quick handoffs to Sutton moved the chains. After a first down incompletion, Kaston Hemphill took off for 24 yards. On the very next play from the 28, he hit Noah Underwood on a corner route inside the five and the freshman receiver battled his way across the goal line for the first touchdown of his high school career.

Mason McCombs hit his second extra point of the day to give Union a 60-7 lead with 1:13 on the clock.

The 60-point scoring output is third most in school history and the third 60-point performance in the last 12 games. The first was a 61-7 victory over Hayesville in week two of last season. Later in the year, the

Panthers put up 63 at Fannin

From 1957 – 2015 the Panthers never topped 60 points in a game. Since week two of 2016, they've accomplished it three times.
