SUCHES - With a time of just under 40 minutes, 15year old Hunter Hartzog of Blairsville turned in the fastest time at Saturday's Run Above the Clouds 10K race.

Hartzog, a freshman on the Union County High School Cross Country squad and a first-time RATC participant, crossed the finish line in 39:36, more than two minutes faster than last year's overall champion's time of 41:42.

"All praise goes to God," Hartzog said following the race. "It was a very challenging race with the ups and downs and changes of terrain. I've ran in cross country races and other 5K events but this was my first 10K.

"It was a great morning to run and there was a nice breeze," he added. "I came here with a friend and I really enjoyed it. It's something that I'll definitely do again.' The overall female

The race course begins at Woody Gap School on Hwy. 60 before meandering approximately 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) through the beautiful Suches Valley. Traveling south on Hwy. 60, the course passes scenic Lake Woody before turning right onto Cooper Gap
