All throughout the tour, a volunteer tour guide will lead people through the different areas, such as the hospital and courthouse, which will be manned by other volunteers

Of course, the tour is all about having fun while revisiting some of Blairsville's most lurid and interesting history and places near downtown, all while supporting the Union County Historical

The idea for the tour came into being about a year ago, when Schmitt met Tobie

Chandler is the tourism director for the Blairsville-Union County Chamber of Commerce, and she asked him then if he'd be interested in researching the area for a possible haunted tour.

Schmitt moved to Union County last year from New Jersey, where he is known for his associations with otherworldly activity.

"I'm a paranormal investigator, have been for about 29 years," said Schmitt. "I've done big projects for Philadelphia, for police departments, for Temple University Hospital, for a lot of big sites.
"We were brought in on

actual operating prisons, and do actual scientific research to try to figure out and find out what's going on in the locations. I was an electrician for 25 years or so, so I've applied my trade skills to paranormal equipment."

Continued Schmitt: "During our investigations of the (Blairsville) locations, we came up with some really intriguing stuff. We have thermal imaging of cold spots . we have EVPs, especially from (the old hospital). The courthouse, we actually have some stuff where whatever it was in the environment has reached out to communicate

"But the focus of the tour is more to do with the actual history of the locations, to get people out and into the community, which is very important."

All tour proceeds will go to the Union County Historical Society. Tour volunteers include members of the Historical Society, local county and city government officials, and several business leaders

and community members. "This is as much a history tour as it is a ghost tour," said Historical Society President Libby Stevens. "We have had

paranormal people who have gone through the buildings and through the properties around. and they have discovered some strange activity. "But the people who


will be leading the tours and meeting with people in the buildings are people who are local and know the history of the community."

UCSO Deputy Rick

Henry was dispatched to an early morning call on Oct. 7 in Eastern Union County regarding a burglary, Detective Lt. Osborn said. A resident in Eastern

Union County reported that \$10,000 in cash and a handgun had been stolen from his garage area. Two suspicious characters, later identified as Sterlachini and Lafferty, had been spotted in the area prior to the burglary, sheriff's reports "We had a call earlier

in the week regarding two suspicious young males at a closed convenience store, Detective Lt. Osborn said. "We acted on that incident, and interviewed that store's A hunch led officers to a

local convenience store where after questioning the store's clerk, that it was discovered that two men fitting the description of the suspects had been in the store and paid for a purchase with a \$100 bill. The clerk also spotted a

roll of \$100 bills being stuffed into the pocket of one of the two young men.

The clerk told authorities that the two had been hanging out at the store, trying to sell drugs to customers. The clerk called 911, and Deputy Alan Patton responded. The two were gone before Deputy Patton arrived, but the clerk remembered the two

Detective Lt. Osborn and Deputy Henry set up

surveillance of the area, realizing that the two had made the store a hang out.

About noon on Oct. 7, they spotted Sterlachini. Having identified him as a suspect, Detective Lt. Osborn patted Sterlachini down. During the pat down, Detective Lt. Osborn discovered a roll of \$100 bills amounting to \$5,000

"I asked him where the other gentleman was, and he took us to him," Detective Lt. Osborn said.

When the officers arrived

at the location where Lafferty was, they questioned his father and stepmother. Lafferty was said to be asleep, however, the officers saw something else happening - Lafferty was overdosed. Lafferty was transported

to Union General Hospital, and later, lifeflighted to Northeast Georgia Medical Center in Gainesville for medical treatment. "We told Lafferty's

parents that the two were suspects in a burglary earlier that day," Detective Lt. Osborn said. "We were allowed to search the premise, we discovered all but \$1,500 of the remaining cash. We also found the handgun. And, we found two handguns reported stolen out of Virginia."

The handguns reported stolen out of Virginia are a .40 caliber handgun, and a 9 mm handgun, Detective Lt. Osborn said.

The officers also discovered an unknown powder substance, believed

to be synthetic fentanyl; 42 viles of an unknown substance that they were told was liquid

"We believe the 42 viles are heroin," Detective Lt. Osborn said. "We also discovered less than an ounce of marijuana, and numerous rounds of ammunition of the .40 caliber and 9 mm variety."

The officers began to communicate with law enforcement in Virginia. Both Sterlachini and Lafferty are well known to law enforcement in that state. "We were told that

these two individuals were gang members," Detective Lt. Osborn said. "Also, Lafferty is believed to have provided heroin to someone that overdosed in Virginia.' Lafferty, who had been

in Intensive Care at Northeast Georgia Medical Center in Gainesville, left the hospital. He was later discovered in Virginia, and law enforcement there taking him into custody for Union County. Both are charged with

first-degree burglary, possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, possession of a controlled substance, possession of a firearm or knife during the commission of a crime, theft by bringing stolen property across state lines, and possession of marijuana, less than an ounce.

Sterlachini is being held without bail at the Union County Detention Center; Lafferty is awaiting extradition to Union County.
