who either enlisted or was drafted during the 1960s, Honaker is a veteran of the Vietnam War, having served two tours in Vietnam as a Graves Registration Specialist, from 1966 - 1967 and from 1969 - 1970. " I found myself

responsible for caring for those who died serving our country," said Honaker. "I don't regret for one minute the service for my country, not one minute do I regret. Would I have liked to have not gone to Vietnam? Yes, it would have been nice. But I don't even regret that because I was able to serve my country and to serve those who fell on the battlefield and to serve their families who waited anxiously for their loved one to be returned to them."

Like many who served during the Vietnam War, like many of those who serve during wartimes and in warzones, the war did not leave Honaker when his tours in Vietnam ended. For many years following, both during his time in the military and after when he went on to serve as a Christian missionary and pastor, the past events he experienced in those jungles clung to him, though differently compared to most.

Honaker wanted his experience in the war to be accessible to his family and loved ones and to those years from now who might wonder what happened during those tumultuous times.

"In early 2000 I began thinking about putting some thoughts on paper about my two tours in Vietnam," said Honaker. "I wanted my children, my grandchildren and future generations to know what I did in Vietnam.

'When I was writing, I

as I progressed, and others read what I was writing, they encouraged me that it was a story that needed to be told.

"So, in October of 2014 I wrote the book, 'The Dead Were Mine.' It details my two tours in Vietnam. It goes into a lot more detail about what I did and why I got into that."

Using diaries, notes and slideshows he kept during his time in the service, as well as case files and reports, Honaker's book joined the ranks of more than 400 titles that have been written about the Vietnam War and the struggles those soldiers faced both overseas and when they returned home, unwelcomed and still trying to sort through the pieces of their life during the war.

"I have received letters and comments from combat veterans and civilians who have thanked me for writing that book," said Honaker. "They said, 'I had no idea what happened to my buddy when I put him on that helicopter.' They had no idea what happened and for them to be able to read that book and be able to understand how well they were cared for and the degree that the United States government took to make sure

that everything was done for them, gave them peace."

Families need closure for their loved ones who never came home. Soldiers need closure for their comrades who fell during the rage and violence of war. And for a moment, no matter how brief. Honaker can provide solace to those who survived, letting them know that the person for whom they grieved was abundantly cared for after their passing.

"For those who have been in war, it is all still very real," said Honaker, "It doesn't go away. It's still emotional. It's still there. You never get
