Partnerships

The Emergency Management Agency of Union County (UCEMA) is responsible for the overall management of any disaster that should befall Union County. The main role of UCEMA is to prevent, prepare, mitigate, respond, and recover from these natural and manmade events. The agency also responds to all types of emergencies such as searches, rescues, motor vehicle accidents, aircraft accidents, floods, large-scale

fires, weather events, or any other event that may require a large number of resources. The EMA does not have an unlimited number of personnel to respond nor does it have unlimited resources to solve any problem. What the EMA does have is partnerships.





In order to be prepared and to respond to disasters, UCEMA develops partnerships with public and private organizations, businesses, and resources. They then use these partnerships to gather, utilize, and coordinate resources for a countywide response to a disaster or large event. Without partnerships, the EMA would not be able to respond to any disaster.

The EMA partners with public organizations such as the U.S. Government, State of Georgia, Union County Government, City of Blairsville, Sheriff's Office, Blairsville PD, Union County Schools PD, Union County Schools, Union General Hospital, Union General Ambulance, Health Department, and many more. The EMA also partners with private organizations in our

community. They include private businesses, corporations, home owners associations, clubs, utility companies, and volunteer groups. These private organizations provide resources such as emergency assistance, equipment, supplies, funding, and personnel in the event The most important partner is the citizens. A disaster affects

us all and places extreme demands on the emergency services. Studies have shown that citizens who are prepared for disasters by being trained and having emergency supplies can relieve some of those demands. Prepared citizens should understand the situation and have enough emergency supplies on hand to sustain the household for at least three days without power. This involves emergency ready kits and other essentials such as food and water.

The Emergency Management Agency is a vital organization

Steady, Unrelenting

Paul Kingsworth sensed that he was the object of a steady. unrelenting pursuit. It was an unwelcome thought until he finally surrendered to it. Kingsworth is an Oxford-educated environmentalist, world traveler, and writer. In an article in "First Things," he tells the happy story of what happened to reset the trajectory of his life.

From his childhood, Kingsworth dismissed religion. "The message seemed irrelevant... Where was the mystery? Where was the promised connection with God? Who was this God anyway? A man in the sky with a book of rules?" In retrospect, he realizes what he missed. "I didn't know back then that the Christian story is the



story of our rebellion against God." What a concise statement of the human condition. It was G.K. Chesterton's statement that describes the next

chapter of Kingsworth's life. "Wherever the people do not believe in something beyond the world," Chesterton wrote, "they will worship the world." Kingsworth, being intrigued by the "intense wonder and mystery of the natural world," became what he calls "a priest of the witch gods," embracing a nature religion. "At last I was home where I belonged," he writes, "in the woods, worshipping a nature goddess under the stars. I even got to wear a cloak. Everything seemed to have fallen into place. Until I started

One night, he had an explicit dream about Jesus. It was so vivid, he remembered what Jesus had said and how he looked. In the coming days, he began to encounter Christians everywhere! They kept reminding him of Jesus. "Every time I looked back, he was still there. I began to feel I was being... hunted? I wanted it to stop; at least, I thought I did." Then one evening just before he was to conduct a ritual, he became so violently ill he could not continue. He was stunned. But He knew why.

C.S. Lewis experienced "the steady, unrelenting approach of Him whom I so earnestly desired not to meet." Francis Thompson wrote of "the hound of heaven." Like them, Kingsworth finally surrendered. "I became a Christian," he writes, "because I knew, suddenly, that it was true." Kingsworth surrendered to

Q. Commissioner, I was approached by a group of people asking me to sign a petition to change our form of county government to a 5-person board. Why would I want to do this? A. I do not recommend changing Union County's form

of government. Changing a form of government is a significant undertaking, and it can be challenging. Add to that task 5 brand new Commissioners with limited to no experience, and the result will not always be what you expect. Change for the sake of change is never a good idea. Residents have only to look around our beautiful county to see what an incredible living environ-



ment we have formed over the years. Meeks Park, the Farmers Market, Senior Center, Recreation Dept offerings such as the pickleball courts, the walking trails, tennis courts, dog parks, Sports Center, etc., - these things don't happen by themselves. They are the result of years of planning and development as well as anticipating future infrastructure needs. This is all important to the future of Union County and its residents and we have done it with some of the lowest property tax rates in the State of GA and without county debt.

Q. Are there any unique benefits of a Sole Commission form of government?

A. There are many, but two main benefits are accountability and speed of decision-making. If a citizen has an issue, they know who to come to. If a decision is needed, it can be made quickly. This has a great benefit in resolving conflicts, attracting economic development, and securing funding opportunities. At the regional and state level, the County speaks with one voice, and a sole Commissioner can form valuable personal relationships with officials who can provide partnerships, grants, and other benefits, from the capital to the Legislature, to GDOT, DNR, EPD, and a host of agencies and non-profits.

Q. Are you against a commissioner board style of county government in Union County?



Home Cooking Baseball

Chiggers

Chiggers are most active during the spring, summer, and early fall. If you haven't been bitten, then consider yourself fortunate, because you live a blessed life. Let's talk about chiggers, what they are, and what you can do to protect yourself from them.

Some people call chiggers red bugs because they are tiny red mites that are less than 1/50th of an inch long. Chigger are mites that are still in



their larval stage. The larval stage is the only one that bites. The other stages of the chigger life cycle either lay eggs or prey on small insects. Chiggers like to live in areas that are full of brush and debris. They can be found in leaf litter. If you have areas with tall grass, they'll like that too. Chiggers mainly bite rodents and rabbits. So. if you have areas that make a good habitat for rodents and rabbits then there is a good chance that you'll have mites as well. Female mites will lay their eggs in the late winter, which will hatch in the spring. Chiggers will reach peak population in mid-summer and remain active until fall. They'll be killed off by a hard freeze.

Chiggers only bite, they don't bury under the skin. When they bite they inject their saliva which has a skin dissolving enzyme in it. As your skin cells dissolve, they drink it up. The saliva that they inject causes irritation, which makes you itch. Chiggers can stay latched on for three or more days, so if you have a chigger bite it's best to wash that spot with lather repeatedly, and then dab the spot with an antiseptic. That will kill most of the chiggers on you.

Chiggers typically like to bite in tight places. That means you'll often get their bites underneath your socks, in your waist band, or

Chiggers are susceptible to dehydration. Therefore, they like to populate areas with shade and high humidity. Removing brush piles and leaves, keeping grass cut, and removing bushes will eliminate areas that they like to live. Blackberry bushes seem to be a particularly favorite habitat. Chiggers don't like temperatures over 90 (I don't blame them), so when our temperatures drop as summer ends, chiggers will become

There are some chemicals that can be used as repellents or to kill chiggers. Products containing DEET will be effective at repelling chiggers, mosquitoes, biting flies, gnats, and ticks. You can also spray it on your clothing to keep them off your clothes. Oil of lemon eucalyptus can be used as a repellent, except for children under 3 years old. Products containing perme-

Another point to consider, the current Sole Commissioner form of government has a great working relationship with the Blairsville Mayor and City Council as well as the school system, TVA, water companies, power company, and Union General Hospital. Other counties sometimes face hostilities between the Board of Commissioners and the City Councils and/or mayors. These relationships are important – especially when projects require partnerships. Additionally, there are strict state regulations that provide guidance on when and how 5-member board Commissioners can meet if a quorum is present.

Q. How expensive is it to maintain a 5-member board of commissioners?

A. Very expensive. First,

Paris... continued from Page 4A most individuals who serve on a board of commissioners earn money for their service and for travel. These stipends can increase the budget significantly. Training is also expensive. Every commissioner has to take specific certification classes through the Association of County Commissioners of Georgia (ACCG) and through the Carl Vincent Institute of Government from the University of Georgia. New Commissioners are required to take initial certification classes as well as other related certifications. These certifications are costly. I have probably taken 100 classes or more throughout the years. ACCG offers three different conferences each year: Capitol Connection Conferences, in Atlanta, which focuses on issues before the Georgia General Assembly; the Annual Conference, in Savannah, which provides a forum to take leadership, governmentrelated, and governmental accounting training; and the Legislative Leadership Conference, in Athens, Macon, etc., as it moves around the state, which allows Commissioners to approve the legislative positions and priorities for the upcoming legislative session. It is imperative that all Commissioners attend these events in order to remain current on local issues. Training, travel, and accommodation can be very expensive for a 5-person Board of Commissioners. Q. I reluctantly signed
