
people are enjoying it, and I just hope everybody can get something they like."

Derrick Moody of Air Life was on hand to discuss the free Medical Helicopter Family Memberships that were arranged in a joint partnership between Union County and Union General Hospital. And there's still time to sign up for that free insurance, with applications available at the hospital and library, and even online, with a deadline of May 15.

Several services are new to Union General and were on display for the fair, including the wound care center, which will soon be opening with its hyperbaric chamber to encourage wounds to heal faster and

There is also a new plastic surgeon in residence, Dr. Edwin C. Pound, who said he does it all - from reconstructive surgery to cosmetics and everything in

"It's just a good thing for the public," said Hospital CEO Lewis Kelley, discussing the fair. "A lot of people can come by, get tested at a real reduced cost. We always find somebody during these health fairs that is in bad shape and needs immediate assistance. So it's a good public service, and we like showing off our hospital, and we like telling people about what we can do."

UGH Chief Nursing Officer Julia Barnett coordinated the event, which featured dozens of vendors and hospital staff, plus hundreds of dollars in medical testing savings for the average would-be patient.

"We want to provide
