

Angie Hughes, Lee University finish third at NCCAA World Series

With her team's season on the line in the Loser's Brackett of the National Christian College Athletic Association Softball World Series, Lee University junior Angie Hughes went the distance in a 3-2 victory for her Lady Flames in the third game of a triple-header in Troutville, Va.

Opponent Mississippi College is one of Lee's fiercest rivals but the Lady Flames put 3 runs on the board in the bottom of the second inning.

And that proved to be all of the run support that Hughes needed.

Union's two-time Class AA Pitcher of the Year surrendered two runs in the fourth - only one earned as Mississippi College inched back into the contest, but Hughes slammed the door.

Usually, Hughes is mowing down the competition, but on this night, she had to rely on her defense, and they came through.

She went 7 innings, allowing 4 hits, 1 earned run, 1 strikeout, and 2 walks.

She fanned four, walked four, and hit a batter.


'The game was a very rough outing, but it was very exciting to come play near to home and see some people I have not seen in awhile," Hughes said.
