The beat goes on: 12-U Girls win Dizzy Dean Fast Pitch Softball Title!

CHICKAMAUGA – The Union County Recreation Department added some important hardware to its trophy case last week as the Union County Lady Panthers' 12-U Softball Team brought home the State Championship from Walker County.

After winning the District Championship in Jackson County last month, the Lady Panthers traveled to Chickamauga to compete in the Dizzy Dean State Fast-Pitch Softball Tournament.

The Lady Panthers drew a line in the dirt as soon as they wheeled into town and made it known to everyone that Union County would be

a force to be reckoned with in this tournament.

Union outscored its opponents 38-9 in the three games, driving home the fact that the Lady Panthers were clearly in a class among themselves during the three-day tournament.

After drawing a bye on Friday, Union played their first game on Saturday morning, and thumped Gordon County 13-2 in four innings.

On Sunday morning, Union knocked out Catoosa County by a score of 12-1, also in four innings, setting up the Lady Panthers for a chance at another state title opportunity later in the evening.

In the Championship Game against the hosts, the Chickamauga Thunder, a see-

saw battle ensued early but Union brought the Thunder down to earth by scoring five runs in the fourth inning.

From that moment on, it became evident that Chickamauga was waiting for the other shoe to drop. It did and Union brought the state title trophy back to Blairsville. The Panthers went on to win in a walk with a 13-6 decision and the celebration was on.

"It was a great team effort to win the title of State Champs," Assistant Coach Dean Everett said. "There were good ball teams at State, but we just jumped on them so hard that it got into their heads."

The Lady Panthers returned home to Blairsville where they were greeted with a parade on Monday evening.

Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris arrived at Meeks Park to greet the Lady Panthers before sending them out on their victory lap through Downtown.

The Union County Sheriff's Office, Blairsville Police Department, and Union County Fire & Rescue escorted the float from Meeks Park and through town.

There the Historic Courthouse Square was packed with supporters, friends, and family, anxiously awaiting the arrival of Union County's State Champions Fast Pitch Softball Team.

They weren't disappointed.

"We just want to thank everyone who made the parade happen," Head Coach Jeff Tanner said. "The

Donations to Iraq War Memorial have begun

The ball is rolling to raise the necessary funds to erect an Iraq War Memorial at Veterans Memorial Park in Blairsville.

Veterans Committee members Roy Hamby, Chuck Honaker and Bob Spaulding met last week with Commissioner Lamar Paris to make the necessary arrangements to collect donations for the memorial.

Donations to the memorial can be made to Union County War Memorial, P.O. Box 91, Blairsville, GA 30514. Steve Rowe will oversee the financial aspect of the collections, and the effort will utilize the county's tax identification number for tax purposes.

"I think this is a significant move forward," Commissioner Paris said. "I think it is fitting that we honor those who fought and served in Iraq. I think it is fitting that we include this tribute to our county's War Memorial."

"I'm behind this 100 percent," he said.

The project is estimated to cost almost \$3,900. Any funds collected over the \$3,900 amount will be utilized to erect a future memorial to those who have fought and served in Afghanistan, once that military action is completed, Commissioner Paris said.

Roy Hamby, the retired Veterans Affairs director for
