Kahne wins at New Hampshire

Kasey Kahne's superior pit strategy helped him win Sunday's Sprint Cup Lenox Tools 301, ahead of Denny Hamlin.

Kahne took the lead on lap 245 of the 301-lap race, as fast-closing Hamlin ran out of time after starting deep in the field on a restart on Lap 240. Hamlin had dominated the race, but a miscommunication on pit strategy cost him valuable track position.

"The guys were on top of things today," said Kahne. "They made the right calls on pit strategy to get me out front."

"I knew Denny was strong, but after getting the lead I felt comfortable with my car. I felt like he was almost as good as we were, but I never felt like we were in danger of losing the race during the last few laps."

Hamlin's team put on four tires, while Kahne's crew only gave him two right side ones. When green flag racing resumed, Hamlin was 13th.

"Yes, we missed a call," said Hamlin. "I told them I needed two tires, and they gave me four, which put me behind Kasey. We had a good car and I'm pleased with what we've been able to accomplish. It seems like our team is getting better and better, but today, we just had a miscue."

Clint Bowyer led several laps, but he was not able to challenge Hamlin or Kahne near the end of the race, and had to settle for third.

"We were off a little bit with our total package," said Bowyer. "We got shuffled around during the last pit stop and that cost us."

Dale Earnhardt Jr. finished fourth. "The car was a hand full today," said Earnhardt. "We were off and couldn't run any better. Track position is everything here, and we couldn't seem to get where we needed to be."

Brad Keselowski, Jeff Gordon, Jimmie Johnson, Kevin Harvick, Greg Biffle, and Ryan Newman rounded out the top-10 finishers.

SHOULD DRIVERS HAVE OWN TESTING LAB

It's been over a week since AJ Allmendinger, driver of Penske's No. 22 Dodge tested positive for some type of drug usage. The results of the second sample have not been made public yet. Should the second one be positive, Allmendinger faces a long, uphill road to regain a NASCAR ride.

Carl Edwards talked to respected journalist Mike Mulhern last week about the problem drivers are confronted with.

"I've thought pretty hard about this. Let's be honest -- this is an imperfect world. People are imperfect, tests are imperfect," Edwards said.

Edwards is known as one of the physically fit drivers in the sport, with a ruthless workout routine.

With dietary supplements, like energy drinks and protein powders, apparently one of the possible issues in the Allmendinger case, Edwards points out "One of the first things my trainer told me was, 'Be careful. Anything you ingest is made somewhere, and you don't know what that factory was making the day before it made the product you're using'."

"Even if it's just a whey protein powder, or something like that, you have to really watch what you ingest."

"I think the drivers need to get together, and we need to have our own group -- that is paid by us -- that works for us...to be here, in tandem with the NASCAR drug testers. To test us at the same time."

"So we don't have just an A and B sample, but an A

and B testing facility. "And we can all agree on the facilities. That's no big deal. I don't think it would be a contentious thing. I think that would remove almost all doubt in any situation about a 'positive' test."

"If a driver had someone they could go to and say this is my representative, and they (both) test at the same time the same day (as NASCAR), and the results are the same, then we could say it's a 'positive,' and if they're not, that would give a different perspective."

"Until we do that, no matter what is found to be positive, no matter what the tests results are, there is always that little impression of maybe there was a mistake."

"Really, at the end of the day, what does a guy -- who doesn't drink, doesn't do drugs, doesn't have any chance of being in violation -- have to gain by subjecting himself to these tests?"

"He has the huge potential -- which is real, because this is an imperfect world -- of having a false positive, or having something happen."

"And that is really scary for a lot of guys in the sport... when you go in there and subject yourself to that."

Schroter wins Masters 50 Mr. Georgia

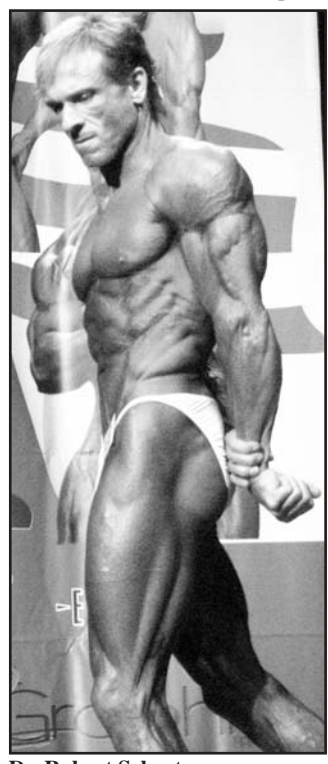
On Saturday, July 7th, Dr. Robert Schroter competed in and won the Mr. Georgia Bodybuilding Competition in the Masters, Over 50 division.
