State that part of school funding should be adjusted (equalized) based on the income or wealth of a county. (This is a separate pot of education money from QBE funding)

To determine the wealth of individual counties, the state based it primarily on property values divided by the student population (FTE - Full Time Equivalent). Utilizing this formula method, Union County has always been ranked as one of the top wealthiest counties in Georgia (for school funding purposes), currently rated at 6 out of 180 school systems.

Q. How much of the total State funding for schools is adjusted with this "Equalization" funding?

A. It generally varies, but currently it is about 7 percent of all state K-12 QBE funding.

Q. Does Union County receive any State "Equalization" funding based on county wealth and property values?

A. No. Probably the nearest school close to our size and being in this part of the state is Banks County that receives \$456,000 in Equalization supplemental funding.

However, Barrow County, although considerably larger than us but in the general area, receives \$6,650,000 of "Equalization" funds, Stephens Co. receives \$670,000 and Habersham Co receives \$1,350,000. Other adjacent county school systems do not receive any "equalization" funding either, including Towns, Fannin, Rabun, White, Lumpkin, Gilmer and Pickens.

Q. How much would Union County property values have to decrease for us to be eligible for State "Equalization" funding?"

A. Our property values would have to be reduced by 50 percent for us to qualify, which makes it impossible.

danger to life or property." Flying the flag upside down in other situations is a misuse of the flag; however (and contrary to popular belief), the current Code does not impose penalties for misuse of the flag. Before 1989 the Code contained criminal penalties for certain acts of desecration to the flag, but in June, 1989, the Supreme Court held this to be unconstitutional. Later that year the Flag Protection Act was passed and it

imposed a fine and/or up to 1 year in prison for knowingly mutilating, defacing, physically defiling, maintaining on the floor or trampling upon the flag. The following year the Act was struck down by the Supreme Court. So today, anyone can mutilate, deface, defile, or otherwise desecrate the flag without fear of arrest. But they best not engage in such conduct within sight of most veterans I know. **Chuck Esposito**
